
While training with Toowoomba Dog Obedience Club all dogs are required & must wear a martingale or check chain.

Failure to have your dog equipped with this will mean you are not able to train your dog that night.

Martingale & check chains can be purchased on training nights from the club window.

Class Pass requirements

Class 2

Turns, Right, Left and 180's

Sit and stand at heel

Sit stay at end of Lead 30 Seconds

Star Heeling with no checking

Class 3

Automatic sits

Turns, right, Left and 180's

Recall on Lead

Heel on loose lead'

Sit for exam

Sit stay to end of lead for 1 minute

Down stay at end of lead for 1 minute

Class 4

Loose lead Healing, no checking

Sits, downs and stands

All turns 90,180,360

Left about u turn and left about turn

Recall off lead

Stand for exam

Respect The Lead

Your Dog may be happy to interact with others but remember that this is not the case for everyone,

If you see another dog on a lead, then respect that they may need some space.

Do

- Do check with other owners before letting your dog interact.
- Do remember that a seemingly friendly dog may lash out if approached whilst on a lead

Don't

- Don't let your dog run over to a dog which is being kept on a lead, they may be on a lead for a reason.
- Don't let your dog off the lead if you cannot easily recall them.
- Don't ignore warnings from other owners about their dog.

Delta Dogs

What is Delta dogs: Delta dogs

Delta society Australia is a national not for profit organisation with one core belief that the human animal bond remarkably improves our quality of life and leaves a lasting paw print on our hearts.

The delta therapy dogs program is the largest of its kind in Australia. Every week Deltas amazing and devoted volunteer therapy dog teams bring joy to the lives of those who need it most. The delta teams brighten the lives of an estimated 20,000 Australians in hospitals and health care facilities.

How you and your dog can volunteer to do the program:

Do you have a good dog with a good temperament?

Do you have an hour or two to spare every week?

Are you interested in giving your time to volunteer in your local community?

Do you love talking with people about your dog?

Things you need to make sure your dog can do:

Your dog needs to be at least 18 months old and under 10 years old and fully vaccinated.

Your dog needs to walk nicely beside you without pulling

Can your dog sit and drop when asked?

Can your dog sit politely and accept a pat from a stranger

Can your dog walk through a Crowd with minimal reaction to distraction?

What is required to become

a Delta Therapy Team?

- Dogs must be at least 18 months old and under 10 years old with basic manners
- Dogs are required to be fully vaccinated.
- Dogs are required to be on heartworm preventative medication and treated regularly for internal and external parasites.
- Dogs are required to undergo a health assessment by their vet which will determine their suitability to physically take on the demands of visiting in the program.
- Your dog will be required to undergo temperament testing, and must pass the assessment in order to accredited as a qualified therapy dog.
- Retesting of qualified therapy dogs is required every two years.
- Volunteers must complete a one day training session and an orientation at their assigned facility before they can commence work.
- Delta therapy dog teams will need to make a commitment for at least one year and generally visit their assigned facility once per week/ fortnight for up to 90 minutes each time.
- The preferred time for visits is generally between 9-6weekdays and weekends.
- All volunteers who join the program are required to be police checked.
- Delta society provides volunteer, dog assessment, uniforms and insurances at no cost to our volunteers.


